**Distinguished Service Cross:** Citation: The Distinguished Service Cross is presented to Ernest H. Anderson, Private First Class, U.S. Army, for extraordinary heroism in action while serving with Company F, 1st Gas Regiment, A.E.F., near Moulin de Guenoville, France, September 26, 1918. Private Anderson, with three other soldiers, advanced nearly 200 yards over an open hillside exposed to machine-gun fire and carried two wounded men to the protection of a nearby trench. Private Anderson has since been killed in action.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS: ANTHONY, HAROLD B.

Citation:

The Distinguished Service Cross is presented to Harold B. Anthony, Supply Sergeant, U.S. Army, for extraordinary heroism in action while serving with Company D, 362d Infantry Regiment, 91st Division, A.E.F., at Bois-de-Very, France, September 26, 1918. Sergeant Anthony, while leading a small detachment operating on the flank of his company, suddenly came under heavy machine-gun fire. Alone he crawled up close to the machine-gun and, attacking it, killed all four of the gunners. He advanced to the nest to see the result of his work, and brought the gun back. He carried it for an hour, but was forced to discard it because of its great weight. Again at Epinonville, France, September 29, 1918, the company was held up by machine-gun fire from front and flank. Sergeant Anthony spotted the machine-gun nest. While attempting to reach an automatic squad to point out the hostile gun he was killed by the machine-gun fire.

As our nation enters the centennial of U.S. entry into World War I, this is a time to remember the many young men and women who left their homes in Montana to serve their country. One of these young men is still honored in our community as namesake for Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1087 Royal A. Caufield Post, Great Falls.

Royal Alvin Caufield was born March 28, 1895 in Great Falls. His parents came to Montana from Canada in 1890 and settled into the young town of Great Falls. One event in Royal's boyhood portended his future, when at age twelve, while shooting gophers with his 22-caliber rifle on his father's ranch in Sun River, Royal accidently shot himself in the left hand.

Fifteen years later, in April 1917, Royal enlisted in Company L of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Montana Infantry Regiment as this Montana National Guard unit was mobilized by President Woodrow Wilson. Demonstrating his boyhood gopher hunting skills, Corporal Caufield quickly earned two expert rifleman and sharpshooter medals. By December, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Montana, now redesignated the 163<sup>rd</sup> U.S. Infantry Regiment boarded the transport ship *Leviathan*.

As the American Expeditionary Forces built up and trained in France, Royal was promoted to Sergeant, and often wrote letters back to his parents in Great Falls. One received by his mother in February, 1918, showed the draconian measures taken by Army censors during the war—this one had the appearance of a picture page after a child had worked it over with a pair of scissors. Impatience for action, Sgt. Caufield and other Montanans from his company requested transfer to Company E of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Regiment. By mid July the 23<sup>rd</sup> Infantry led a surprise American-French offensive near Chateau Thierry, and on July 18<sup>th</sup> in the Battle of Soissons, Sgt. Royal Caufield was killed in action when his position was overrun by German forces.

Sadly, in the fog of war Sgt. Caufields' fate became blurred for another six months. In September, the Caufield family received a letter from a comrade in Royal's unit advising them that their son had been killed. The U.S. Army initially reported him missing, then months later wounded, and not until late January in 1919 did the Army advise the family that Royal had been killed in action.

In May 1921, Sergeant Royal A. Caufield was buried in Highland Cemetery with full military honors. Two years later, a new veterans post was organized in Great Falls, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1087, Royal A. Caufield Post.

According to dispatches received from Washington, Joseph E. Daly, well known in GF has been decorated for distinguished bravery at the front. The croix de guerre has been conferred upon him by the French. Others receiving the same honor for similar conduct were Major R. B. Paddock, of the signal serbive and 22 other members of the signal corps. The specific act for which Daly was then honored was sticking to his post on May 3, and while under constant fire and through a gas attack he maintained communication with other units.

Daly, who is a native of sandborn, Minn., came to Great Falls in 1914 as a telegraph operator. Later he was connected with the Montana Oil company and when he was called to the National army was traveling representative of the company. He left GF with the third contingent Octover 7, last and after a few weeks training at Camp Lewis started east, reaching France before Christmas. He has two sisters and a brother, and graduated from the Sanborn high school. He is 23 years old, and so far as is known is the first GF soldier to be thus honored. [GFTD June 2, 1918.]

Camp Lewis, Dec. 10.—More wounded soldiers from overseas arrived here today, among them 25 white and 13 colored men from Camp Dix, J.J. The men will receive convalescent treatment here pending discharge from the army.

Among the returning soldiers was Private Joseph Goodisky, who enlisted in Seattle in the fall of 1916. Goodisky went overseas as part of the first division in the convoy with which General Pershing traveled. He also was in the first battle in which the Americans participated in Lorraine.

At Cantigny, on June 18, after fighting 13 hours with his comrades to hold the village, Goodisky was wounded. Bits of shell extracted from his body caused army officers to ascribe the hurt to a piece of 16-inch shell from a naval gun. Goodisky's left hip joint was shot away. He expects to resume mining when finally discharged from the army, For five hours after being wounded Goodisky was forced to remain in a shell hole before he could be taken to a dressing station.

Body Will Arrive Here During Week. funeral of Sergeant John L. Griffin, Killed in Germany to be Held in City. The body of Sergeant John L. Griffin, killed by a German sniper while serving in the army of occupation at Coblenz, Germany, three months after the signing of the armistice, will arrive in GF the latter part of this week from New York for burial, according to word received from the war department. The funeral will be under the auspices of the GF post, American legion, and interment will be in Calvary cemetery, in charge of the W. H. George company.

Griffin was buried in the American cemetery at Coblenz, and the body, with a shipment of several others, arrived in New York last Friday from overseas. He served with Company I, 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry, 3<sup>rd</sup> Division, during the war, and was wounded at the Battle of the Marne, in July 1918, but returned to duty four months later.

A brother, Dan Griffin, is a member of the GF fire department. [GFTD 2 Aug, 1920, p. 10]

MONTANA IS ON WAY. Funeral of John L. Griffin, Killed in Coblenz, Germany, to Be Held Here.

The first body of an American soldier killed in France during the world war to be brought to Montana was landed in New York, Thursday, according to information received by Dan Griffin, a member of the Great Falls fire department. His brother, former Sgt. John L. Griffin, was killed by a German sniper at Coblenz, Germany, on February 20, 1919, over three months after the signing of the armistice. The body will arrive at the chapel of the W. H. George company within a week.

Sergeant Griffin was a member of Co. L, Fourth Infantry, and in the battle of the Marne was severely wounded. After spending four months in a base hospital he was sent to the army of occupation and billeted at Coblenz. It was there in February 1919, that he was killed by a German sniper, and he was buried in the American cemetery near that town. He was a nephew of Mrs. George E. Sullivan of Williams, Mont.

Dan Griffin his brother was a member of the 9<sup>th</sup> Machine Gun Company, Third division.

Monarch, Oct. 23.—People of this vicinity yesterday turned out in large numbers to pay final tribute to the memory of Private LeRoy Hunt, son of Mrs. Carrie Hunt and the first soldier boy from this place that had died while serving with the colors. Private Hunt died at amp Lee, Petersburg, Va., and the body was brot home for burial. Miles City, Oct. 18.—Already decorated with the croix de guerre with a palm attached, the highest honor bestowed by the French government on an American private, Rawls Hunt, of Miles City, has been further honored by being the recipient of a citation in the orders of the French army for energetic and devoted action in an engagement at Juvigny in August, 1918.

Mr. Hunt lost a foot in the war. he is living with his father at 1409 Phillips street. He was a member of the 127<sup>th</sup> infantry which was liaisoned with the French at the time the conditions arose for which he received the further citation. The following is a literal translation of the French inscription on the order:

"Citation I the order of the army.

"Corporal Lewis Hunt.

"A very energetic and devoted corporal, Aug. 31, 1918, at Juvigny, he executed several dangerous patrols during which he took numerous prisoners. Was wounded toward the last of the action.

"The marshal commander in chief of the armies of the east.

(Signed) 'PETAIN.'

RAWLS HUNT IS WOUNDED IN FRANCE. E. B. Hunter has received a telegram from Washington notifying him that his half brother, Rawls Hunt, was severely wounded in the fighting of August 31 in France. This is the second time that Hunt has been wounded in /france, having been wounded previously. Rawls Hunt, before enlisting with the second Montana regiment of national guards in June, 1917, was employed in this city by the Great Northern Express company. He arrived in England December 25 and shortly afterward went to France. When last heard from he was a member of Company B of 128<sup>th</sup> Infantry. He has two other brothers in France, Albert in the aviation service and Harry, who is an ambulance driver. Hunt came to Great Falls in 1909 and lived here continuously until his enlistment. Ray Lezard who died in France from the effe4cts of gas received while in action in the Argonne forest, formerly worked in the smelters in this city. He enlisted from here and was well known and liked by many friends. His mother, Mrs. Ada Greenhalge, of Columbia Falls, Mont., recently received a letter from a chaplain of a base hospital, where the young man died, and it contains beautiful words of comfort for a heart-grieved mother. The letter follows:

"My Dear Mrs. Greenhalge: You have doubtless learned some time ago that your son, Ray Lezard passed away on February 14 and that he was buried with full military honors on Feb. 16. I write you not from a sense of duty, but because of the fact that in the last four weeks your son lived I came to know him well and also to love him. As you already know he died from the effect of gas received while in action on October 3, at a town named Apremont in the Argonne forest. At that time he was with the 77<sup>th</sup> Division, which was on the left of the 28<sup>th</sup> (your son's division), and I know personally of the last battle in which he fought. I have been over the ground and saw a part of the fight myself and I can say to you that your son's part in this battle was a worthy one. His companions being killed, he operated his gun until he himself fell unconscious. He was one of the men who willingly sacrificed himself that the line might hold.

He was sent to the hospital here in Vichy and his weakened condition made him the prey of pneumonia, diphtheria and finally bronchitis, from the effects of which he died. I was with him every day for a period of over three weeks, and I found him to be a man of great spirit. He would get discouraged, but then he would shake off his illness of heart and begin to talk of home and what he should do when he got back. He spoke of you was very beautiful indeed. He was serious, happy despite his pain, and was one of the most religious men I have met in my experience as a chaplain. We read portions of the New Testament and prayed together daily. It must comfort your heart as this time to know that he was not afraid to died and that he died in the hope that he would some day meet you, never to part again.

"I wish there was something that I could say that would comfort you; I very well know how inadequate our words are in a time like this, but I assure you that I suffer with you, for I have lost a friend. My heart goes out in sympathy to you. You are, Mrs. Greenhalge, honored to have given the kind of man that Ray Lezard was to such a cause.

"If there is any information that you desire, or if in any way I can be of service to you, please do ot hesitate to write to me and I shall do my best to help you. Yours very sincerely. J.N.R. SCORE. Chaplain Base Hospital 109.

General Pershing, in the name of the president, has awarded the distinguished service cross to Corp. Jess Marlin, deceased, of Billings, in the following citation, which has just been released for publication:

Corp. Jesse Marlin, deceased, Company B, 127 Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action at Juvigny, France, August 31, 1918. Corporal Marlin was one of a party of three officers and two men who, armed with on German machine gun and three German rifles, attacked a machine gun next held by 70 Germans. Under terrific fire from the enemy, who laid down an artillery barrage upon their position, they concentrated their rifles so effectively that 32 Germans surrendered within an hour. After the prisoners had been brought in Corporal Marlin, with a private, established another machine gun in an advanced position and kept up a concentrated fire on the Germans until he was wounded in the body five times by machine gun bullets.

Robert Jayne Maxey was born in Brandon, Mass. in 1872. Graduate of West Point, 1898. [Anaconda Standard June 3, 1918, p. 10: Friday's casualty list among those killed in action in France carried the name of George E. Mooney of Glasgow. Young Mooney was one of the first to enlist from Glasgow after this country entered the war. He enlisted July 19, 1917, and at once was sent to Helena, where he entered the Second Montana and was his regiment reached France last Christmas. He was 20 years of age and was born and reared at Glasgow. His father, Thomas H. Mooney, is one of the pioneers of Valley county and resides on a ranch ten miles north of Glasgow.

[Conrad Independent October 7, 1921, p. 3: After the stormy trip across the channel we landed at Le Havre and marched to British Rest Camp No. 2 (so-called) and on December 29, began our first box car journey to the French garrison town of La Coutine.

This was the last time the regiment was all together, one battalion under Major Williams was sent to Bordeaux, one to Langres and the other to St. Aignan. About this time we learned with heavy hearts that the division was to be broken up and most of the personnel used as replacements. In February the dissertation started, nearly 3,000 men were transferred from our regiment to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup>, 32<sup>nd</sup> and 42<sup>nd</sup> divisions, leaving what was known as a training coterie of 50 non-coms to each company.

In March the remnants of the regiment were reassembled in the St. Aignan district and its duties as a replacement and training unit began. Here replacements were received from the states; equipped, drilled in the use of gas masks, bayonet fighting, etc., and sent up to the front. During the summer of 1918, 290,000 men passed through the came of the 41<sup>st</sup> division, and though the men longed to get to the front and away from the heart-breaking work that they were called upon to perform, they realized that this work was necessary and performed it in a manner that brought them many compliments from those higher up.

The old Second regiment was never privileged to meet the many in battle as one organization, but the individual officers and men who did battle with other units wrote a record in history that Montana may well be proud of. Our losses were as follows:

Three officers, 88 men, killed in action; 35 men died of wounds; 28 men died of disease; 19 officers and 289 men wounded

While individuals of the old regiment won 18 of the 53 S.S.C. awarded to Montana, a loss and achievement equal to most of the regiments that won glory in battle, but it was our lot to suffere without the reward of having those at home know of our deeds.

During the spring and summer of 1917 thousands of Montanans offered their services to the government in other organizations than the Second Infantry, until a total of 11,709 had voluntarily entered the army and 1,862 in the Navy and Marine Corps. On May 18 congress passed the selective service act and on June 5 all en between the ages of 21 and 31 were required to register. It was feared that there might be some trouble on this day but with the exception of an anti-draft parade in Butte, which promptly disbanded on the appearance of troops from Company F, Second Montana Infantry, then stationed there, there was no disturbance in the state.

The estimated population of Montana was put at 952,474, when in fact we had a population of 496,131. So we raised troops on a basis of the population twice as great as we actually had. Even then Montana reached more than ner quota with a grand total of 39,271 in the Army and 1k862 in the Navy, exceeding by 25 per cent all other states in the union. She furnished 996 soldiers out of every 10,000 population as compared to 296 for Georgia, which stands at the foot of the list.

Out of these troops Montana lost 681 killed or died of wounds, 253 from other causes, or a total of 934 dead, 2,469 wounded, and one missing, or a total of 3,443 casualties. Again establishing a record above all other states with a like population. While her soldiers were awarded 53 D.S.C. for acts of heroism on the field of battle; a record that all Montana may well be proud of. Montana had troops in practically all of the combat divisions and it is safe to say that there was not a part of the front where America participated that did not feel Montana's effort. There were a number of the old Second Infantry with the First Division at Cantigny when America struck her first offensive blow and it was here that Montana suffered her first losses in this section when John J. White, of Miles City, private, Company A, 16<sup>th</sup> Infantry, and formerly private, Company E, Second Montana infantry, was killed in action February 9. Others who fell in this sector between the 1<sup>st</sup> of February and [p. 2] the end of the battle of Cantigny,

were George E. Mooney, of Glasgow, formerly private Company G, Second Montana, but serving as private in headquarters company, 16<sup>th</sup> Infantry, when killed May 4 [sic, 9]. Ray Brent, of Helena, private 1<sup>st</sup> Class, machine gun company, Second Montana Infantry, serving as private 1<sup>st</sup> Class, Second Brigade Machine Gun Battalion, killed May 27. Loraine York, Mareo, Montana, company G, Second Montana, serving as private 1<sup>st</sup> Class, Company H. 16<sup>th</sup> Infantry, killed May 31. Harry Barrick, Company G, Second Montana, serving as Private 1<sup>st</sup> Class Company I, 16<sup>th</sup> Infantry, Killed June 3. Hasso A. Briese, sergeant, 1<sup>st</sup> Field Signal Battalion, killed June 4.

Perhaps the first Montana man to fall was Elmer L. Cowan of Victor, Montana, Company D, 20<sup>th</sup> Engineers who was killed February 3 in the sinking of the *Tuscania*. In the fighting between February 1 and June 5, three officers and 38 enlisted men from Montana were wounded.

In June when the German advance began to threaten Paris, the American 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> divisions threw themselves into the fray along the west face of the Marne salient and the 42<sup>nd</sup> to the east of St. Quinton. There were hundreds of Montana men with these units and scores of them fell in the desperate fighting that followed. On July 15, when the 3<sup>rd</sup> Machine Gun Battalion blocked the Paris road at Chateau-Thierry a large number of the old Second Montana machine gun company was with them and here two Montana men were decorated for bravery. When the 32<sup>nd</sup> Division went into the drive July 30<sup>th</sup> and through five days of terrific fighting pressed the Huns back from the Oureq river to the Vesle there were perhaps more Montana men engaged than with any other division and the newspaper accounts gave Montana the credit of taking Hill 230 and Belleau farm on August 1. Many Montana men were also with the 4<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> Divisions in the drive to the Vosle, but by far the greater number of Montana men to go into a fight together were with the 91<sup>st</sup> Division when it jumped off in the Argonne forest on the 26<sup>th</sup> of September. This division fought its way northward through Very and Epionville until relieved by the 32<sup>nd</sup> in fron of the Germans on October 3. One brigade of the 91<sup>st</sup> went in again between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 32<sup>nd</sup> on the 8<sup>th</sup> and fought its way over Hill 255 and through the Bois Mikicy until relieved by the 42<sup>nd</sup> on October 11.

From this front the 91<sup>st</sup> was moved to Belgium where it went in with the 37<sup>th</sup> Division to aid the Sixth French Army on October 31<sup>st</sup>, reaching the Lys river on November 3, where they were relieved by the French. They went in again on November 10<sup>th</sup>, and were advancing when the armistice was signed. The victory was won and Montana had don her full share and had suffered more than her share of the losses.

Since the early days of the territory Montana citizens have stood ready to defend the sate and the nation, and whenever they have been called upon to do battle they have acquitted themselves with credit.

Winnett Times: A message from the war department was received here Monday evening, bearing the sad intelligence of the death of Steele W. Morgan, a member of the Marines, at a base hospital In France. Steele was the oldest son of Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Morgan, who live southwest of town, and was very well known here. He enlisted In the Marines in April, 1918, but was not sent across until in November, landing in France about, a week before the signing of the armistice. Two letters, written to his sisters here, and which were received the same day as the news of his death state that he was just ready to leave for a visit with another brother who served as a member of the heavy artillery, and he also stated that he expected to start home soon. The message failed to give any particulars of his death only stating that he died as a result of an operation to amputate both limbs, crushed in a railroad accident. The date of the accident was given as June 9th and it is supposed that it happened while he was on his return to his post of duty.

Steele was a young man of the highest character and in the seven years he spent here made friends by the score. He worked at the Jim Wilson ranch near the Flatwillow for- three years preceding his enlistment and proved up on a homestead on Yellow Water. His bereaved parents have the fin- cere sympathy of the entire community, who bow in homage to the boys who paid the supreme sacrifice, that liberty might not perish.

Miles City, Dec. 1.—Capture of a long string of machine gun nests and about 80 prisoners near Eclisfontaine, France, on September 27, 1918, has brought to first Lt. John F. pahlke, whose home is Miles City, a distinguished service cross.

Pahlk and Sgt. Lamar Black, the citation says, asked permission to route some snipers who were annoying the troops. They succeeded and decided to silence another nest. This was the flank gun of the enemy machine gun line. Forcing members of the crew to locate the next gun, they moved on, repeating their success until nearly 80 men were captured with their guns.

They then turned the German guns on the enemy, and the citation says, "the success attained by Lieutenant Pahlke and his companion, y their remarkable feat, was so great as to completely demoralize the enemy resistance and make it possible for the regiment to resume the advance with but little opposition."

Havre, Dec. 5.—According to information received by relatives, Lieutenant Robert A. Patterson, a Havre boy, is a prisoner in the German military prison at Karlsruhe, German. This news was first received thru a cablegram to the International Red Cross.

Lieutenant Patterson was in the aviation branch, as an artillery observer, and was thru all of the fighting at St. Mihiel, the Argonne and Sedan, and was probably taken prisoner in the final fighting just before the armistice was signed When he was wounded his pilot was killed.

Lieut. Patterson's wife and baby reside in Havre, as do his parents, Mr and Mrs. R. A. Patterson and a sister, Mrs. H. W. Wheeler.

Relatives here have learned that he is well and receiving good treatment, but they have not learned when he is to be released. [GFTD December 6, 1918]

Blois, France, Aug. 8, 1918.

Dear Brother: It has been an awful long time since I have heard or wrote to you, but we have been in the trenches so long and not a chance to write or do anything but fight, and lots of that. You can tell by my writing that my hand is not as steady as it should be.

I was wounded ten days ago but everything is going fine so don't worry. I was shot in the right chest just above the lung. It went straight thru and came out my back, but had an operation just the same. I expect I will be up in about three weeks or so.

I am in hospital No. 43. There are about 17 men in the same ward with me, all of them wounded and getting along fine, so what more can we expect, and the boys on the front are driving the Huns back every day. We have them on the run, and are going to keep them running. I suppose you have read in the papers of the great gain we had and the prisoners we have captured. Believe me, it takes the Americas to go after them. We are fighting in open warfare, the trenches are not in it at present, although we would have to dig ourselves in at night or for a few hours, just a hole big enough for two of us to crouchi into. How would you like to be digging a hole for you to sleep in tonight, or to sae your life from shrapnel hitting you in the bean? A little hole is a geat help to a soldier on the battlefield.

Well, brother, my arm is about all in so will come to close. Will write again in a few days. Have lots of time while in the hospital. Write and tell me all the news there is. Hoping this finds you well, give all the boys my best regards.

GF, May 30.—According to the official casualty list of Wednesday and an official notification to his parents, Carl A. Sipher of GF was killed in action in France. Age 22, son of Mrs. William B. Murry of the Montana Hotel. He came from Ohio to the Bearpaw mountains when he was 15. He was called up from Chouteau County in the drafted last September, went to Camp Lewis and was sent to England as a member of the 163<sup>rd</sup> Infantry, afterward transferred to the 16<sup>th</sup> Infantry in which he was serving when he fell. That the army officers, even while contending with problems of the Hun drives, do not forget their men or the mothers of the boys who are fighting and dying in defense of civilization is evident from a letter received in Great Falls last week by Mrs. William B. Murray, mother of Private

Carl A. Sipher, who was killed on a battlefield in France some weeks ago. The letter is as follows: Mrs. Idella Murray,

Great Falls, Montana.

I am writing this, Mrs. Murray, as commanding officer of the late Carl A. Sipher, whom our records show to be your son. I feel sure that you have been notified of his death prior to this letter but I wanted to write to you and tell you the circumstances of his passing, as far as military censorship will permit.

Private Sipher was killed in action on May 1, 1918. The company trenches were being bombarded by German artillery throughout the day. The trenches, being very new, had no real protection against a direct

hit by a German shell. Private Sipher with a comrade was off duty and was sleeping in a trench under a shelter of a few branches covered over with earth, when a German "105 mm" shell hit directly on the shelter. Both men were killed instantly. The body of Private Sipher was marked by a tiny scratch on the forehead and one on the hand, while that of his companion was mutilated by the exploding shell. There is o doubt but that both of these heroes died without even wakening from their sleep. H have seen men killed—more than I care to think about—but the death of your son was a death that all soldiers hope for—if die we must.

These are among the company's first casualties and it depressed all of us, as Private Sipher, though a comparative newcomer among us, had gained the respect of all of us by his coolness under shell-fire. He was in line to be made a non-commissioned officer and had his career not been cut short he would have led his squad throughout the remainder of our stay at the front.

The personal effects of your son were shipped and should reach you by the time this letter arrives. Our records show that he carried \$10,000 worth of insurance which will realize about \$58 per month for 20 years.

I might tell you that there is a simple soldier's grave the flag-draped body of a brave soldier lies. Over the grave is a plain wooden cross, bearing a metal marker. On this there is the inscription:

"Died for his country. Pvt. Carl A. Sipher, No. 42562, Co. D, 16th U.S. Infantry, May 1, 1908."

I offer you my deepest sympathy—I realize how little our efforts can console you; but we should all be as brave as the men who are giving their lives for their country.

I am sorry that I cannot write more of the incidents of your son's death, but I have other mothers to write to—with this same mission. I will be very glad to do anything at all in regard to your wishes if such is possible here. Sincerely,

On the day following the receipt of a proud letter from him announcing the fact that he had been promoted to corporal in the signal corps of the engineers his parents received the laconic message from the war department announcing, "We regret to report that Cecil Sullivan was killed in action o June 11.

Another Son Wounded. I was not the only blow that came to the Sullivan family yesterday. Closely following the first message was another, also from the war department, which informed Mr. and Mrs. Sullivan that another son, Jerry, had been slightly wounded and was being moved to a base hospital in France. Jerry also is with the engineers. In his last letter he told his parents how his regiment had marched through the canp occupied by Cecil's regiment.

"I saw Cecil," Jerry's letter said, "but he was eating his dinner and didn't see me, and we couldn't stop, but just had to keep marching along.

Both boys landed in France together, Cecil went from Camp Lewis to the camp of Long Island and Jerry, enlisting at Tacoma, Wash., went to Camp Greene in North Carolina. It so happened that the different units to which the brothers were assigned met in New York and the same transport took both across. They landed in France on the day before Christmas.

Was a Butte Boy. Cecil Sullivn was one of Butte's best-known boys. Born and educated here, he became on of the star players of the Silver Bow Park nine. He was employed at the Butte Duluth mine in the acid plant when he went with the draft from Butte last October. He spent but a short time at Camp Lewis before being sent East.

His letters home have been most cheerful. He told of the kind of places he had visited without naming them and described the havoc.

Edward Walsh Killed in Action October 11. Genial Young Irishman Volunteered to Fight for His Adopted Country. Anaconda Bureau.

Anaconda Nov. 22.—While friends and relatives in this city were rejoicing in the news of the declaration of the armistice and making preparatios for his homecoming, news campt tonight that Edward Walsh was killed in action in France Oct. 11. The brief message received from the war department was sent to his brother, Patrick Walsh of this city, with whom he made his home, and the news of its receipt, which spread quickly, brought sadness to great numbers of friends whom the young man made in his eight years of residence in this city.

Born in Canckacross, County Monaghan, Ireland, July 22, 1880, he came to this country before reaching his majority and immediately took steps to become a citizen of the land of his adoption. His regard for America did not stop with the granting of his citizenship papers, for early this year, long before his draft number was called, he volunteered for service and left for Camp Lewis Feb. 21, 1918.

With a sunny temperament and ready smile he made friends easily and kept them steadfastly. His interest in sports of all kinds was especially directed toward football, in which he participated as a member of the Anaconda team for a number of years. He was an active member of the Mill and Smeltermen's union and of division NO. 1, Ancient Order of Hibernians.

Surviving are his mother, two sisters, Mrs. Mary Finnegan and Mrs. Anna Burns, and two brothers, Michael and Francis, still in Ireland; two brothers Patrick, 609 Alder street, with whom he made his home, and John Walsh, 415 Alder street, as well as a number of nieces and nephews residing in this city. KENNETH ARNOLD IN GERMANY

Montabaur, Germany, Feb. 19, 1919.

My Dear Mother:— I have an hour and a half to spend, before I can go to bed, so will answer your nice letter of January 28, received this morning.

Am well as usual and hope that you are all able to say the same. Hate to think of the influenza starting anew over there. It seems to be growing a little more serious here the last couple of days. Am going to take the best of care of myself, so don't worry over me, for I feel real lucky.

Tonight the school had seats reserved at the show hall for the students, so I stepped out and went to the show. It consisted mostly of wrestling and boxing.

Am attending school every night and am getting real interested in the work. If only the outfit don't change to to another station. All of the old bunch have been relieved except me. so I look for it any time, but will put up a holler.

Got a letter from Morris yesterday. He Is anxious for me to come down again. Believe I will try to, around the first of the month. If I do we will have our pictures taken together, and it will be entitled "the Arnold family on the Rhine."

I can't figure out who the Great Falls boy is you spoke of. There are several boys in our outfit from there. Am afraid that, Mrs. Nelson's story is a bit exaggerated. Suppose it started from my letter to Mr. Hibbard. In his letter lie asked me to write of some of my experiences, so I related just one. I told him, and you can see just how people stretch things. It was on October 4th, a year from the day I left home. That reason alone caused me to feel a little queer.

Well anyhow it was the first day of our attack in the Argonne. The signal detachment was sent to establish an advanced post of command. The place designated for the P. C. was right in the midst of a heavy German barrage, sent over to stop or catch our second wave of infantry. That meant that we would have to walk thru this barrage and also set up station in It. A very pleasant walk indeed, expecting any moment to be blown to a million pieces. When ever a shell hit real close. we would flop, or hit the ground for pieces usually fly high and the closer you hub the ground the safer you are. Sometimes if we had time we would crawl in a shell hole.

Well anyhow we made it to where we were supposed to establish, it being right in the barrage line. The first thing everyone did was to get out their mess kit covers and start digging in. You should have seen the dirt fly. We soon had a pretty good trench dug which afforded us considerable protection from flying pieces. Then we had to set up our wireless station. In wireless you know there is always an aerial, which is a single wire about eighty feet long put up on the bamboo poles. This wire was cut into three times, by shell fire, while we were trying to put it up.

That's what I told Mr. Hibbard, and is probably where Mrs. Nelson got her story. Ben Daggit, who I suppose will soon be back can tell you about it, for he was one of the bunch. Poor devil after we had dug in he and another fellow were called upon to string a telephone line, he hated to go, but never whimpered. The boy that was with him was wounded while they were out. Very often that morning I thought of you folks, and how darn slim my chances were of ever seeing you again. Suppose you wonder how we carried our wireless and telephone equipment, so will tell you. We carried it on our backs.

Well that, enough of that old war stuff. The question now, is when are they going to sign peace, and send us home. Guess no one knows except God, and he won't tell. A few are leaving on account of sickness etc., at home.

Am glad that you get out more. When we get home, we will all try and have a good time together.

Well mother one of the boys just came home and talks so much that I can't keep my mind on my letter and any how its nearly time to call my relief, so will close for this time. With love to you all, from Kenneth.

Manatabaur, Germany, Feb. 15., 1919

My Dear Mother:-

Well mother another week has passed with everything rolling along about the same as usual. Received your letter of January 19, a couple of days ago. Sorry to hear that the influenza has started again do hope that it don't get serious, and that you all escape it. There are still a few cases here, but it gradually dying out. I was rather sick yesterday, stayed In bed all day, got up along towards evening and went down and got a physic and some pills, got

up this morning feeling much better. Guess I don't get enough exercise, laying around the radio station, but still I take walk every day. Have been pretty lucky alright, over here over a year, living under bad conditions most of the time, and never been to a hospital or even missed a day's duty. But 1 must not brag for there's plenty of time yet.

Wonder if you received my picture o.k. Suppose you would rather have one of me alone, but you see it was thusly. We were rather short of funds so we bunched up, and got a half a dozen each. Am going to have some more taken soon.

Things look rather gloomy for an early return home, don't they. All I've got to say is that I wish they would either settle it or else fight it out, and have it done with. Guess it hasn't soaked through these squareheads that they are licked. They better change their ideas, darn soon, for if these Americans ever start on them again it is going to prove disastrous for them.

I understand that a bill has passed whereby the soldiers over here will not be allowed to wear service stripes any more. Guess those guys over there got jealous and put in a kick. By ge, I believe that a man who has been over here, and through the game, deserves a little distinction, but it don't appear that they do, "Give 'em slum."

Received a letter from Roy yesterday. He has been assigned to the military police. He says we probably won't allow him to stay at home when we all get home, for you know the line soldiers are not very keen for the M.P.'s. Last night I answered Mr. Porter's letter. Gave him a line that will keep him thinking for a while, I guess.

You spoke of you and Irma going to church, well ma you haven't anything on me, for I'm getting real churchy myself. Go every Sunday evening. We have a fine chalin. Church Sunday nights, school five nights a week, and Saturday nights, I go out for a little recreation.

Not long now before I have another birthday. Twenty four, ge I'm sure getting old. Well lets hope that I won't spend another one over here. That's what I hoped last March wasn't it. Maybe we will be more successful this time.

Well mother I'm working overtime just to finish this letter, so I will close now and call my relief. Hoping you are all as well as usual, I remain as ever, Love to all, Kenneth.

Mr. and Mrs. E. C. Arnold, of Big Sandy., have three sons with the overseas forces, all of whom are with divisions still retained in France and Germany. They are Lieutenant Roy Arnold, serving with an infantry regiment; Corporal K. D. Arnold, with the signal corps, and private Morris Arnold, who is with the Marines. Before enlistment in the war against Germany the brothers were with the American forces on the Mexican border. Roy and Morris volunteered their services shortly after war was declared. K. D. remaining with his parents until his number was called. All of them have been overseas for nearly a year and Morris and K. D. were in the heavy fighting of last summer. Morris was gassed in the last battle in which he took part and was confined to hospital for seven months. The lieutenant was assigned to duty outside the fighting zone immediately after arriving in France and, as he sees it, was so unfortunate as to be denied a chance at the Hun. He was commissioned a lieutenant at an officers training school in the U.S., graduating as the youngest member of his class. [GFTD April 27, 1919]

Receives citation. "Distinguished and Exceptional Gallantry: reads a citation which was received by Morris C. Arnold of this city last week. The incident for which the citation was presented occurred in the Meuse-Argonne offensive on November 6, 1918, when Arnold with three companions were detailed to flank a German machine gun position which was holding up the advance of their organization He was a member of the 74th Company, 6th Regiment, US. Marines, and served with this organization through their experiences

with the A.E.F. with the exception of seven months which was spent in a base hospital as a result of being gassed during the first tour of duty on the front lines. PAUL S. LUND WRITES LETTER FROM FRANCE.

The following letter from Paul S. Lund now in service in France, will be of much interest to his friends in this vicinity:

France. Nov. 23, 1918.

Dear Dad: -

Tomorrow is Dad's Letter day, and eta that I can be certain this letter can get the quick service which has been promised us, in delivery, I am penning it tonight.

It will then be censured tomorrow warning and go forward.

And for the first time I can tell you definitely where I am. Guess I'll begin with the time we left the United States. This first part I am taking from my diary.

We broke camp at Camp Mills the night of November 25, and proceeded to Hoboken. N. Y., by train and ferry boat. At the piers we boarded the ; transport Henry R. Mallory at about noes. We dropped down the harbor :We rsupper and some time during' eke night our voyage began. Five! transports, one collier and a cruiser 'sad a destroyer. When I iiv likened in the morning I fle3, the boat rolling a little all right, LintI climbed out of my bunk and streased. As soon as I got on my feet, Siestaver. I began to feel dizzy. I re-itscrited on it to Kenneth Arnold, and herald he felt the satn way. I rap-idity ticame worse, and instead of go-ts:gap en deck, I climbed back In my, /nut Arnold did the same -in fact, tie-. We started a sig, sag sours then, and that night we hardly moved at all. The next day we 1.• gun atelt:ng for the fleet of de-stroyers which was to convoy us to a port. They did not meet us until the seventh, but whn they finally were slighted, believe me every man wait up on deli watching. At first we saw one little speck 00 the horizon, and tnen another and another, until we counted ten In all. They certainly could trav-el. Barely ten minutes after the first one came dashing into our midst. The flagship held a I:ttle \confab\ with the deseroyer and cruiser which had es- corted us thus far, and then they star- ted for home again. When the little destroyer passed our ship we gave her a mighty cher. Thn the fleet of de- stroyers encircled us, two leading, three on each side and two bringing up the rear, and we once more started on our zig-zag course for \somewhere\. We felt pretty safe with those little destroyers protecting us. Wish you all could have seen them. Their speed is marvelous, and they are so low in the water that when a big wave came along it looked as though they would be sniothered. They were always on the alert, dashing here and there, backwards and forwards, and when a ship was sighted, one of them was off after it \Pout de Suite.\ (meaning \mighty quick.\) The rest of the voy- age passed without incident. The last two mornings we were called before daylight and on deck, In Cable a \sub\ should happen to get us. On the morning of the tenth, just at daybreak, we sighted land, it was a small island off the coast of France, and about an hour later a seaplane was soaring high over, head, on the lokout for submarines. Then more land was sighted, which proved to be the mainland, and about noon we were steaming up an estuary. Here the destroyrs turnd back. They ame very close to us as they passed us, and bel:eve me, we crtainly did some cheering. We proceeded slowly, and flualy came into the harbor of St. Nazaire. Our fourteen day voyage was completed and we were now in France. December 12th we disembarked, and were marched out to Camp No. 1. We remained In St, Nazaire until December 17th. But on the 15th the bat-talion was split up and some left us. Among those were Kenneth Arnold and Earle Landsborough, two of my best friends. How I did hate to see them leave. I have had one letter from Arnold since we parted, but I know now that they went up to the front and were attached to the First Division, which has made such a name for itself In this year's fighting. We started our trip inland on 1k-- c ember 17th, riding in little box cars bearing the legend \40 hommes, 8; cheveaux\ (40 men or 8 horses). Our destination was unknown. Some I thought we were on the way to the front, while others thought we were to b trained. For my part, I thought one !thing one minute, and something else, the nexL I Perhaps you can trace our journey I on a map. The first town of any size that we passed through was Nantes. I then Poltiere. Limoges, and then our destination, La Courtine. The trip; lasted a little over two days (50 hours) I It got pretty cold, so we were glad to get to the end of our journey. We were quartered in stone barracks at I La Courtine. We were the first Amer-; lean troops in GI town and were naturally enough something of a curiosity. We now learned that the 41st Division had been made a replacement division.

On Christmas day General Liggett, now commander of the First Army, gave us a little talk and told us he was sorry we were not going to the front as a unit -and so were we. From then on bunches of the boys started leaving us -some were sent to signal schools, some on other details, and some to the front. On January 16th the battalion received orders to pack up again, and on the 18th just as we were ready to leave, along conts an ordr dtalling ten men front each company for service at the 2nd Corps schools. I was included in this bunch, so the battalion pulled out and left us there. We left the next day. Now, see if you can trace this journey. We passeil through Clermort. Nevers, hCagny, and Dijon, I irrivin gin Chatillon-sur-Seine on Jan- uary 21. This trip was quite pleasant. We had been paid just before we tel so bought small luxuries at the di. ferent places where we stopped aiiii changed trains. Sometimes we trate eled first class, sometimes second and a little of the way third class, but not once'in a box car. We were the first Americans to arrive ni Chatillon-sur- I Seine (pronounced Shateeyon-su-Sane) and you should have seen the kids fol-lowing us as we marched up the street, our little band of 28 men (2 became sick at La Courtine and were left behind). Well, we found an old build- ing beside the river Seine, which was 'not occupied, and here we billeted. We laid around a few days and then more troops arrived, infantry, artillery, engineers and aviators, and then yo learned that schools were to be started here and that our detachment was as-signed to the signal school. On Feb. !tool opened and from then on it hos continued regularly, turning ut classes upon classes. And here I hate been ever since. But we certain - I have become proud of our school.; It has become known as the best In; ce, and everybody here has work- ed hard to maintain that record for it. There are now eight men op here in the office and congratulate me I ant chief clerk. Unfortunately. 'we have been on detached service all the time and have thrfor had to get along without any promotions. But I that's all right as long as we have won I the war. I At times we have been pretty anx- ious to get up to the front and get a real slam at the Hun, but somebody cerminly had to be in the Service of Supply and we were among those che• seri. No mu ter where they were placed, or Alm: the work, they made good, and with very few exceptions they have kepi away from all things unmanly an I have always conducted themselves a gentlemen. It was quite nrominent here, also, but seems to dying out. None of us here at the signal school were taken sick. Today I received three letters from Iva, the hash one mailed November 2. I Sin- said site had just heard front! Mamma. Also said it had started snovellg in Minnesota, and was getting pretty cold. How is it in Montana? Hope you are all comfortable. Wish; I could walk in on you all back there seine evenfng. It won't be long now, though. I am going to write a letter to John McPherson's father thfs evening, also, he is the boy who died in our detach-ment last August. I received a letter from his mother some time ago, and she wanted to know where he was bur - 1 :ed. and so on. Now I can give them all that information, and I don't want it delayed, as I know even that little knowledge a euld help in their bereave- ment. Lund, 2nd Signal Carps School, American E. F., Prance. A. P. 0. 730. ARVID F. WALL GOES UP IN AIRPLANE. The following letter was received by Mrs. C. R. Wall, from her son, Arvid F. Wall, who is serving with the Ma-rines in France, and tells some of the young man's experiences in the air: Monday, December 16, 1918. Deal Folks: - What do you know about it, I have already received Elsa's and 'era's Christmas letters. It was just eigh- teen days front the time you mailed them to when I got them. At times it ony takes a few weeks and then again it may take a couple of months. Car- penter and I are down here at the Red Cross to writet. I just got through having a nice cup of chocolate, rice and jam bread. I get chocolate and jam quite often, but believe ma, I as a rule, have to pay for it. Yesterday Carpenter and I were out to the aviation field trying to get up in one of the planes. I was successful, but 118 didn't get the chance. They hadn't flown for three weeks, so they were behind in their battery and pho-tographic work, otherwise he could have got a chance too, but I just hap-pened to be lucky. We had asked sev- eral mechanics and observers to go up in their place, but none could let us (they had so much work outlined to do). But Carp. and I became separa- ted and I went and helped lift a plane cut of the mud, that had come down, go the squadron commander told one of the meilanIcs to \let the marine go up, because he helped.\ Wel, I got In and they strapped me down and put a helmet and goggles on mean d started a .th a roar. At first it seemed like a car, but we went too fast for one. We got to going (I should judge) about sixty miles an hour, and I had just about made up my mind to get out and walk if we went any faster when we started to leave the ground. The sensation was the same as going up

an elevator. Vi e flaally got up quite a distance, and then he went straight ahead towards Tours, climbing all the time. He d d some up and downs, and it was some- what like a roller coaster. We flew around about twenty-five or thirty minutes, and one time he did a kind of a wing slip sideways (I think they call It), and we started for the hangars. He certainly landed fine, only a couple of jumps and we were done. I shook hands with the pilot and thanked him, and described how I felt. He asked me if it made me sick. I told him \No but my stomach re- fused to stay down when he went that fide slip. I told him that I had expect- ed to be frightfuly afraid and sick. but it was sure some sport and I don't be- lieve I have ever spent as good a day in my life as I did Sunday. Can you feature me flying over Tours, France, a city so old that they claim Caesar was thrown out of a sa- loon in a fight here 50 B. C. We were up a couple thousand feet, and the vineyards and town looked like a little park laid out in squares. And what's more -in a \Liberty\ plane. I was surprised to hear in Elso's. letter that Lloyd was in Washington, D. C. They have some of the finest barracks in the marine corps in b. C. One of the Red Cross girls and a fel- low here are playing \French Check- ers.\ In French checkers you can jump either way. I never play. I haven't time to sit down long enough to play checkers or anything else. Too busy cleaning up. I sure always have something to do. Believe me, I could use about seven sisters now to keep my cloths in shape. I hire it done when I have the \Francs though. I will have to leave you now, but will write tomorrow. With love, ARVID.

#### GERMAN-BORN SOLDIER ENLISTS WITH BRITISH.

Edward Weissbach, Home From France, to Return.

Corvallis, July 5,--Special—Because he would not be sent overseas with the American Expeditionary Forces on account of his nativity, Edward Weissbach, a German-American, decided to enlist with the Canadian forces, and left yesterday for Butte. "As long as Kaiser Wilhelm is to be got, want to be in line to help get him," said Weissbach yesterday, "and I want to go through to the front." Weissbach was honorably discharged from the U.S. Army after having seen active service in France with the heavy artillery. En route to America he was on the torpedoed transport Antilles, and was in the water several hours before he was picked up. Since returning he has been dissatisfied, and rarin' to go back to the front. The U.S Army would have accepted him for service in America, but they refused to allow him to go overseas. #### CORVALLIS YOUTH HOME FROM FRONT

Edward Weissbach Faced Hun in Trenches Across No Man's Land.

## LAUGHED UNDER FIRE

Was on Transport Antilles Torpedoed by the Germans.

Engagements with Mexicans on the border, battles with the Huns in the trenches in France and then a narrow escape on the torpedoed transport Antilles are the experiences that Edward Weissbach, an American soldier of Corvallis, had all in the short space of a year. Now he is home on a furlough.

He was a member of the first contingent of American soldiers to land on French soil.

"The boys of battery F did not mind being under fire," he says. "They just laughed when a shell burst over their heads and then sent another steel-jacked love-not across No Man's land into the Hun dugouts."

First Fighting in Mexico. He enlisted April 27 of last year. He was in the field artillery and was assigned to Battery F of the Fifth Regiment, which was stationed on the Mexican border. It was there that he received his baptism of fire in battles with the Mexicans,. Early in June his Battery was ordered to came out of the trenches unharmed, but suffered injuries when the transport Antilles, on which he was returning to this country was torpedoed. He was four weeks in a hospital recuperating from his injuries and has been stationed at Governor's Island, New York.

France Welcomed Americans. "All France, it seemed to me, turned out to meet us, as we were among the first American troops to land. Women, children, old men and soldiers gathered along the route of march, cheered us, threw flowers at us and wept for mere joy, so delighted were they at our coming. It was raining hard when we landed and the roads were quagmires, but we plunged through the mud and to a point back of the frontm, where we enjoyed some preliminary training before going into the trenches. We were lodged in the vacant houses of the deserted towns just back of the first lines, comfortable quarters, but not exactly safe, as the Germans peppered the towns frequently. We were well fed and certainly have no kick coming on that score.

Four Days Under Fire. "On our first trip into the trenches we stayed four days before we were relieved and though the sensation was not exactly novel, as we had been under fire on the Mexican border, there was sufficient excitement to keep us awake day and night during our detail. The bursting shells did not bother the

men at all; they simply laughed and sent back a few in exchange. The reaction when the men come out of the trenches is one of the most peculiar sensations which the soldier have to combat. It simply can't be explained, but you have a feeling that you must take a stuffed club and go out and hit somebody. Off duty we enjoy ourselves in various ways and try to forget about going back until the order comes."

Weissback expects to return to duty in a few days, after visiting with his friends in Corvallis. He is under sealed orders and may not divulge his destination, he said.

*Harold H. Joyce*, First Lieutenant Company I, One Hundred and Twenty-eighth Infantry, killed August 30, 1918; **Raymond J. Saunders**, first lieutenant Ninety-fourth Aero Squadron, killed October 23, 1918;

George Ahlquist, second lieutenant Three Hundred and Twenty-seventh Infantry, killed October 20, 1918;

**James C. Simpkins**, second lieutenant Two Hundred and Fifty-fifth Aero Squadron, killed September 18, 1918; and **Randolph C. Stocker**, second lieutenant Company D, Thirty-ninth Infantry, killed September 28, 1918.

*Emmet E. Carruthers*, first lieutenant of Company A, Three Hundred and Sixteenth Engineers, died of wounds, November 2, 1918.

The following officers died of disease or other causes:

Winfield S. Faulds, first lieutenant Thirty-fifth Sanitary Squad, died October 10, 1918.

Cyrus J. Gatton, first lieutenant First Aero Squadron, died November 4, 1918.

Clinton V. Reed, first lieutenant Medical Corps, Base Hospital No. 40, died October 7, 1918.

Charles L. Watkins, first lieutenant Headquarters Detachment, Signal Reserve Corps, died June 23, 1918.

George S. Reisz, second lieutenant, Headquarters Detail, Aviation Instructor, died September 19, 1918.

Montana's soldiers who won the Distinguished Service Cross were fifty-three in number. The award of the Distinguished Service Cross is confined to anyone who may distinguish himself or herself by extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy of the United States under circumstances which do not justify the award of the Medal of Honor, and may be awarded to any person who while serving in any capacity with the army distinguishes himself or herself. Following is given the names of the heroes who received these awards and details of the deeds for which they were thus honored.

*Arthur Aamot*, sergeant, Company D, 126<sup>th</sup> Infantry. DSC. For extraordinary heroism in action near Juvigny, France, August 29, 1918. Sergeant Aamot had sought cover in a shell hole, after a difficult advance in the face of heavy machine-gun fire, when he observed distress signals from a tank nearby on which concentrated artillery and machine-gun fire was being directed by the enemy. Leaving his shelter, Sergeant Aamot proceeded through the fire to the tank where he found a wounded man, whom he courageously carried to safety. Residence at enlistment: Saco, Montana.

*John Ora Adams*, second lieutenant, Ninth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Medeah Farm, France, October 3, 1918. He remained on duty after receiving two shrapnel wounds in the arm, and continued to lead his platoon to its objective. He directed the consolidation of his position and the reorganization of his platoon before finally reporting to the aid station, eight hours after being wounded. Residence at appointment: Kalispell, Montana.

*Ernest H. Anderson*, private first class, Company F, First Gas Regiment. For extraordinary heroism in action near Moulin de Guenoville, France, September 26, 1918. Private Anderson, with three other soldiers, advanced nearly 200 yards over an open hillside exposed to machine-gun fire and carried two wounded men to the protection of a nearby trench. Private Anderson was later killed in action. Emergency address: Mrs. Christine Anderson, mother, 706 Chestnut Street, Anaconda, Montana. Residence at enlistment: 706 Chestnut Street. Anaconda.

*Oliver Anderson*, sergeant, Company L, Three Hundred and Sixty-second Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Steenbrugge, Belgium, October 31, 1918. Sergeant Anderson, with two other soldiers, attacked a strong machine-gun position from which destructive fire had been poured into his platoon and the platoon of the flank company, wounding his lieutenant, the platoon sergeant and many others. They drove the machine-gunners from the position, thereby enabling the line to continue the advance. Residence at enlistment: Sand Creek, Montana.

*Harold B. Anthony* (army serial No. 2260112), supply sergeant, Company D, Three Hundred and Sixty-second Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action at Bois de Very, France, September 26, 1918. Sergeant Anthony, while leading a small detachment operating on the flank of his company, suddenly came under heavy machine-gun fire. Alone he crawled up close to the machine-gun, killed the gunner and captured four prisoners. Again, at Eclisfontaine, France, September 29, 1918, the company was held up by machine-gun fire from front and flank.

Sergeant Anthony spotted the machine-gun nest. While attempting to reach an automatic squad to point out the hostile gun he was killed by the machine-gun fire. Emergency address: Alex H. Anthony, father, 1 122 Sharp Avenue, East, Nashville, Tennessee. Residence at enlistment: Y. M. C. A., Miles City, Montana.

*Ivan Y. Bailey*, private, Intelligence Section, First Battalion, Three Hundred and Sixty-first Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Gesnes, France, October 10, 1918. While on a liaison patrol Private Bailey and Corp. Carl G. Theobald attacked and captured a hostile machine-gun nest and its entire crew. Private Bailey then took the prisoners across "No Man's Land" to the American lines under machinegun fire. Residence at enlistment: Fort Shaw, Montana.

William Belzer, second lieutenant, Air Service, observer, Observation Group, attached to Fourth Army Corps. For extraordinary heroism in action near Jaulny, France, September 12-13, 1918. On September 12, Lieutenant Belzer, observer, and First Lieut. Wallace Coleman, pilot, while on an artillery surveillance mission, were attacked by an enemy plane. They waited until the enemy was at close range and then fired fifty rounds directly into the vital parts of the enemy machine, which was seen to disappear out of control. The next day, Lieutenants Belzer and Coleman, while on a reconnaissance mission, were attacked by seven enemy aircraft. They unhesitatingly opened fire, but owing to their guns being jammed were forced to withdraw to the American lines, where, clearing the jam, they returned to finish the mission. Their guns again jammed and they were driven back by a large patrol of enemy planes. After skillful maneuvering, they succeeded in putting one gun into use and returning a third time, only to be driven back. Undaunted, they returned the fourth time and accomplished their mission, transmitting valuable information to the Infantry headquarters. Residence at appointment: Glasgow, Montana.

*Henry N. Benoit* (Army serial No. 2293659), private, first class, Company D, Three Hundred and Sixty-first Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Gesnes, France, September 26 to October 4, 1918. During eight days while acting in the capacity of runner between his company and battalion headquarters, Private Benoit was constantly subjected to heavy shell fire, but performed his mission without thought of personal danger, carrying the many messages promptly and successfully. Residence at enlistment: Ekalaka, Montana.

Arthur I. Clark (Army serial No. 2258790), sergeant, Company C, Thirty-ninth Infantry, Fourth Division. For extraordinary heroism in action near Esnes, France, September 26, 1918. Sergeant Clark was in command of one platoon of his company, which was being held up by intense enemy machine-gun fire. Accompanied by two other soldiers, he voluntarily made an attack on one of the nests under heavy fire, firing a rifle grenade into it and forcing its surrender. He then advanced on another machine-gun nest and captured it, taking seven prisoners from both nests. His platoon having been forced to fall back by machinegun fire from the rear, he reorganized it and led it in a successful attack on seventy-five of the enemy whom he discovered nearby. Residence at enlistment: Helena, Montana.

*Oscar Clauson*, private, Company F, Three Hundred and Sixty-second Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near the Scheldt River, Belgium, October 31, 1918. When the advance of the front line was held up by the fire from a machine-gun nest 300 yards to the front, Private Clauson, with two others, crossed the open field in the face of fire from enemy artillery, machine guns and snipers. Charging the nest they killed two of the crew, wounded two others and captured five, together with the machine-gun. Residence at enlistment: Havre, Montana.

*Milan Debney* (Army serial 2293685), private, Company B, Three Hundred and Forty-eighth Machine Gun Battalion, Ninety-first Division. For extraordinary heroism in action near Eclisfontaine and Tronsol Farm, France, September 27 October 1, 1918. Throughout five days of action Private Debney maintained liaison between company and battalion posts of command, repeatedly passing through enemy barrages and constantly subjected to enemy sniping. Residence at enlistment: Care of the Baltimore Hotel, Butte, Montana.

*Louis C. Dolce*, corporal, Company C, Second Field Signal Battalion. For extraordinary heroism in action near Exermont, France, October 8, 1 91 8. He volunteered and laid a telephone line to an advanced observation post under heavy artillery and machine-gun fire, working his way the entire distance of nearly 1 kilometer through dense undergrowth and barbed-wire entanglements. Residence at enlistment: 632 Maryland Avenue, Butte, Montana.

*Charles H. Evans* (Army serial No. 574149), private, Company B, Fourth Division. For extraordinary heroism in action near the Bois de-Brieulles, France, September 27, 1918. When his company was held up by heavy enemy

machine-gun fire, Private Evans and two other soldiers advanced in the face of intense fire and captured the enemy machine-gun nest, from which the fire had been coming, killing two of the enemy and' capturing three prisoners with their machine gun. Residence at enlistment: Lewistown, Montana.

*Austin Gates* (Army serial No. 14556), private, Company M., Sixteenth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Charpentry, France, October 3, 19 18. He went forward with three other soldiers, and, though subjected to intense enemy fire, rescued a wounded soldier who had fallen in advance of the American lines. Residence at enlistment: Drummond, Montana.

*Leonard E. Guy* (Army serial No. 572657), sergeant, Company C, Fifty-eighth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Nantillois, France, September 27, 19 18. Sergeant Guy displayed exceptional courage in attacking single-handed a machine-gun emplacement, capturing the gun and taking as prisoners three machine-gunners. Residence at enlistment: Great Falls, Montana.

**Benjamin P. Harwood**, second lieutenant, Field Artillery, observer, Twelfth Aero Squadron, Air Service. For extraordinary heroism in action near Chateau Thierry, France, July 5, 191 8. He volunteered, with another plane, to protect a photographic plane. In the course of their mission they were attacked by seven enemy planes of the Fokker type. He accepted the combat and kept the enemy engaged while the photographic plane completed its mission, but his guns jammed and he himself was seriously wounded. After skillfully clearing his guns, with his plane badly damaged he fought off the hostile planes and enabled the photographic plane to return to the American lines with valuable information. Residence at appointment: Billings, Montana.

**Rudolph P. Hassler**, sergeant, Company K, Three Hundred and Sixty-second Infantry. For extraordinary heroism at Gesnes, France, September 29, 1918. Although he was seriously wounded, he remained in command of his platoon until he was relieved next morning, displaying exceptional devotion to duty. Residence at enlistment: Sumatra, Montana.

*Harry Hildebrand*, sergeant, Company C, Third Machine Gun Battalion. For extraordinary heroism in action near Soissons, France, July 18-24, 1918. He went forward beyond the front line, exposed to fire of snipers, and repaired and put into action an abandoned enemy machinegun. Later, his platoon commander being wounded and the platoon becoming disorganized through direct artillery fire, he took command, gathered reinforcements, and protected a dangerously exposed flank of the infantry. He also voluntarily led his machine guns with the attacking battalion, rendering most efficient service until wounded. Residence at enlistment: Butte, Montana.

*Melvin B. Johnson* (Army serial No. 84054), corporal, Company M, One Hundred and Twenty-seventh Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Gesnes, France, October 14, 1918. When his battalion was held up after suffering heavy casualties from flanking machinegun fire, he went out alone with an automatic rifle to a position 250 yards in advance of the American lines, and, although subjected to intense fire from three directions, operated his gun and so neutralized the enemy fire while his battalion reformed. Pie was killed on this mission, undertaken on his own initiative. Emergency address: Mrs. Oliva Johnson, mother, Clear Brook, Minnesota. Residence at enlistment: Greve, Montana.

*Clifford M. Jordan*, private, Company L, Sixteenth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Cantigny, France, June 2, 1918. He went forward under intense machine-gun and artillery fire and assisted in the removal of a wounded soldier over a distance of 1 kilometer. Now deceased. Emergency address: J.I. B. Hanson, friend, Malta, Montana. Residence at enlistment: Malta, Montana.

*Emanuel Karch*, private, Company B, Sixteenth Infantry. Displaying exceptional initiative and bravery throughout the operations south of Soissons, France, July 18-22, 1918; he with extraordinary heroism, July 21, with two companions captured two machine guns that were causing heavy losses to his company. Residence at enlistment: Angela, Montana.

*Eugene F. Knoke*, private, Company M, Three Hundred and Sixty-second Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Gesnes, France, September 29, 1918. He performed his duties as company runner with the utmost fearlessness, crossing fire-swept fields on two occasions to carry important messages to neighboring units. Residence at enlistment: Glasston, Montana.

*Christian Kurle*, private, Company H, Three Hundred and Seventh Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Oches, France, November 4, 1918. Exposing himself to heavy machine-gun fire, Private Kurle crossed an open field 300 yards wide and rescued a severely wounded comrade. Residence at enlistment: Angela, Montana.

*Arthur S. Long* (Army serial No. 44521), private, Company D, Sixteenth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Hill 272, France, October 9, 19 18. Facing direct fire from a 77-millimeter gun which was enfilading his company, he advanced against the gun with an automatic rifle. Attacking the German gun position, he captured the crew, making it possible for his company to hold the ground it had gained. Residence at enlistment: Box No. 57, Roberts, Montana.

*Luzius Luzi*, private, Company M, Twenty-third Infantry. For extraordinary heroism. He fearlessly and frequently passed through heavy machine-gun fire while performing his duty as runner near Chateau Thierry, France, June 6, 1918, after being twice wounded. Residence at enlistment: Salesville, Montana.

**Daniel McAuliffe**, corporal, Company M, Sixteenth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action in the Argonne Forest, France, October 4, 1918. Leading his squad on enemy machine-gun nests which had been inflicting severe casualties on his platoon, Corporal McAuliffe opened an effective bombing attack on the nests, and, although severely wounded, remained in command until the strong point was reduced. Residence at enlistment: 939 Hornet Street, Butte, Montana.

*William McLoughlin*, private, Company A, Third Machine Gun Battalion. For extraordinary heroism in action near Berzy-le-Sec, France, July 21, 1918. He advanced against a machine gun, and, single-handed, killed or captured the entire crew. Residence at enlistment: Anaconda. Montana.

**Duncan A. McRae**, sergeant, Company M, Three Hundred and Sixty-second Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Gesnes, France, October n, 1918. He took out a patrol for the purpose of ascertaining the position of the enemy and the location of machine guns. Three of his men were killed but he continued on over a difficult terrain and returned with information of the highest value in subsequent operations. Residence at enlistment: 902 Ninth Avenue, Helena, Montana.

*Carl J. Maier*, private, first class, Company I, 362<sup>nd</sup> Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action at Bois de Cheppy, near Meuse, France, September 26, 191 8. Working with a patrol in an attack on an enemy machine gun, he crawled upon the emplacement and without assistance killed three enemy gunners and captured their machine gun. Residence at enlistment: Glendive, Montana.

Jesse Marlin, corporal, Company B, One Hundred and Twenty-seventh Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action at Juvigny, France, August 31, 1918. He was one of a party of three officers and two men who, armed with one German machine gun and three German rifles, attacked a machine-gun nest held by seventy Germans. Under terrific fire from the enemy, who laid down an artillery barrage upon their position, they concentrated their rifle fire so effectively that thirty-two Germans surrendered within an hour. After the prisoners had been brought in, Corporal Marlin, with a private, established another machine gun in an advanced position and kept up a concentrated fire on the Germans until he was wounded in the body five times by machine-gun fire. Emergency address: L. C. Hall, friend, General Delivery, Billings, Montana. Residence at enlistment, same.

**Robert J. Maxey**, lieutenant-colonel, Eighteenth Infantry. On May 28, 1918, at Cantigny, France, he advanced with the first wave and, in the face of heavy shell and machine-gun fire, located the objective of his battalion. He was a cool, dependable and heroic leader. Although fatally wounded, he gave detailed instructions to his second in command and caused himself to be carried to his regimental commander and delivered important information before he died. Emergency address: Mrs. Lu Knowles Maxey, wife, 900 First Street, Missoula, Montana. Residence at appointment: same.

*Frank D. Miller* (army serial No. 2706), private, Medical Detachment, Twenty-eighth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Exermont, France, October 1-12, 1918. His detachment having been reduced to but three men, Private Miller displayed conspicuous courage and devotion to duty in caring for and evacuating wounded across an area swept by shell and machine-gun fire to the regimental aid station and returning with badly-needed

medical supplies to the forward aid station. His conduct was an inspiration to his associates, their commanding officer being absent and the sergeant in charge having been killed. Residence at enlistment: Great Falls, Montana.

- *James H. Moore*, Jr. (army serial No. 3137555), corporal, Company E, Two Hundred and Seventh Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action in the Argonne Forest, France, October 2, 1918. During an attack, when his platoon encountered enemy wire, Corporal Moore calmly went forward and alone proceeded to cut a passage through the wire. While performing his work he was subjected to the fiercest fire of enemy machine guns and grenades, which wounded over half the platoon. He continued in this work until he accomplished his purpose. Residence at enlistment: Ridgway, Montana.
- John J. Murphy, private, first class, Battery F, One Hundred and Forty-eighth Field Artillery. For extraordinary heroism in action near Nantillois, France, October 31, 191 8. Private Murphy displayed a remarkable example of heroism by carrying two wounded men from the gun pit after being seriously wounded himself, when a German shell exploded within a few feet of the piece which was being loaded, setting fire to several boxes of powder and to the camouflage cover of the pit. After carrying the wounded men to safety, he returned to the pit, closed the breech of the piece, verified it's laying, and fired it, preventing what probably would have been a very serious explosion. He was quickly carried to the aid station, where it was found that he had suffered serious burns from the terrific heat, besides being wounded in several places by shell fragments. Residence at enlistment: Butte, Montana.
- *Vincent A. Nolan* (army serial No. 303736), pharmacist's mate, third class, United States Navy, attached to Company E, Fifth Regiment, United States Marine Corps, Second Division. For extraordinary heroism in action near St. Etienne, France, October 5-9, 191 8. During the operations at Blanc Mont Ridge he repeatedly went through intense machine-gun fire and shell fire to administer first aid to officers and soldiers who were wounded and lying in exposed positions. Residence at enlistment: Livingston, Montana.
- *Cornelius J. O'Brien*, sergeant, Company E, Second Engineers. For extraordinary heroism in action near Ville-Savoye, France, August 11, 1 91 8. While engaged on the construction of a bridge over the Valle River, he voluntarily left shelter during intense fire and carried one of his wounded officers through a heavy machine-gun and artillery fire to a dressing station. Emergency address: Mrs. Mollie Prine, sister, 2 Ridgely Avenue, Butte, Montana. Address at enlistment: same.
- **Solomon Peterson**, sergeant, Company I, Three Hundred and Sixty-second Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action during the Argonne offensive, France, September 26-29, 191 8. He repeatedly led patrols in successful attacks on enemy machine-gun emplacements, displaying calmness and keen judgment. After being wounded he insisted in remaining in command of his platoon. Residence at enlistment: Mosley, Montana.
- *Philip W. Prevost* (army serial No. 2284906), private first class, Company D, Three Hundred and Sixty-fourth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Eclisfontaine, France, September 28, 1918. A combat group had worked its way far ahead when the remainder of the line was held up by heavy bursts of machine-gun fire, and the order to dig in and hold the position was given. Private Prevost volunteered to carry the message through heavy machine-gun fire to the combat group, which was still advancing. He delivered the order and returned with information which enabled the battalion to make dispositions for the capture of the line of enemy machine-gun nests and the saving of the combat group. Residence at enlistment: Geyser, Montana.
- *John E. Reese*, sergeant, Company F, Three Hundred and Sixteenth Engineers. For extraordinary heroism in action at Audenarde, Belgium, November I, 191 8. He volunteered to accompany an officer and three other soldiers on a reconnaissance patrol of the City of Audenarde. Entering the city under heavy shell fire, the party reconnoitered for seven hours, while it was still being patrolled by the enemy, advancing two kilometers ahead of the American outposts and beyond those of the enemy. Residence at enlistment: 415 South Colorado Street, Butte, Montana.
- Charles L. Sheridan, captain, Company A, One Hundred and Sixty-third Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action on Hill 230, near Cierges, France, July 31 and August 1, 1918. He demonstrated notable courage and leadership by taking command of the remnants of two companies and leading them up the hill and into the woods against violent fire from the enemy. He personally shot and killed three of the enemy and under his direction six machine guns were put out of action and the hill captured. Residence at appointment: 1022 West Curtis Street, Bozeman, Montana.

**Robert A. Simpson** (army serial No. 41804), private, Company A, Sixteenth Infantry, First Division. For extraordinary heroism in action near Soissons, France, July 22, 1918. After being wounded, Private Simpson returned to the line and continued to carry messages with absolute disregard of his own safety until he was wounded a second time. Residence at enlistment: Shelby, Montana.

*Sidney Smith*, private, Company H, Three Hundred and Eighth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Bainarville, France, October 28, 1918. When his company had been cut off from communication he, though seriously wounded, refused to seek shelter. He participated in several attacks with courage and -aggressiveness, using his rifle very effectively and encouraging his comrades. When relief came he walked back to the dressing station so that medical attention could first be given to the more seriously wounded. Residence at enlistment: Blaine, Montana.

*Clayton Evans Snyder*, second lieutenant, Ninth Machine Gun Battalion. For extraordinary heroism in action near Cunel, France, October 13, 1918. Although wounded by machine-gun fire, he refused to be evacuated, and, going out into No Man's Land, located several enemy machine guns which were endangering his platoon, and directed the fire of his men with such accuracy that the guns were silenced. Residence at appointment: Malta, Montana.

*Carl J. Sonstelie*, first lieutenant, Third Brigade, Tank Corps. For extraordinary heroism in action near Montfaucon, France, September 26, 1918. He displayed bravery and leadership of a high order in the advance toward Montfaucon by going out ahead of the engineers, reconnoitering a tank route under fire, and urging the tanks forward. He located the resistance in the Bois de Cuisy in advance, later rallying disorganized soldiers and enabling them to hold that point. Residence at appointment: 628 Third Avenue, West, Kalispell, Montana.

*Gilbert Straabe*, private, Company D, Three Hundred and Sixty-first Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Gesnes, France, Octo her 3, 191 8. He voluntarily and unhesitatingly left shelter under heavy shell fire and without thought of personal danger rendered first aid and carried a wounded comrade to a place of safety. Residence at enlistment: Devon, Montana.

*Joseph J. Sullivan*, corporal, Company M, Three Hundred and Sixty-second Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near Gesnes, France. Observing that the left flank of the regimental line was unprotected, he voluntarily took out a combat patrol, and, while so doing, encountered three machine guns, which were employing effective enfilade fire. Boldly advancing to this position, he silenced the guns. Residence at enlistment: Jordan, Montana.

*Clarence W. Thompson* (army serial No. 1039036), sergeant, Battery F, Tenth Field Artillery, Third Division. For extraordinary heroism in action near Greves Farm, France, July 15, 1918. Responding to a call for volunteers, Sergeant Thompson, with eight other soldiers, manned two guns of a French battery which had been deserted by the French during the unprecedented fire, after many casualties had been inflicted upon their forces. For two hours he remained at his post and poured an effective fire into the ranks of the enemy. Residence at enlistment: Van Norman, Montana.

*Waldo Thompson*, corporal, Company C, Second Field Signal Battalion. For extraordinary heroism in action near Exermont, France, October 5, 1918. He voluntarily went forward in the face of a most destructive bombardment and kept in repair the telephone line connecting the infantry and artillery, thereby assuring the close co-operation between these two elements. Residence at enlistment: 1108 East Sixth Street, Anaconda, Montana.

*Hans L. Tveten*, private, Company K, Three Hundred and Sixty-third Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action at Gesnes, France, September 29, 191 8. When his company was under fire from two German machine guns, he crept forward alone and put the guns out of action with rifle grenades, capturing, single-handed, four Germans and both machine guns. Residence at enlistment: Sandcreek, Montana.

*Herman Wallenmaier*, private, Company D, Sixteenth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near the Argonne Forest, France, October 9, 1918. Although suffering painfully from wounds, he remained with his company during the entire action, and then was evacuated only when ordered to leave by his commanding officer, being unable to proceed further because of the loss of blood. Residence at enlistment: Valleytown, Montana.

*George Whitcomb*, private, Company B, Ninth Machine Gun Battalion. For extraordinary heroism in action near Gunel, France, October 12, 1918. Although seriously wounded, he refused to be evacuated until he had gone under heavy artillery and machine-gun fire to four other gun crews, requesting that men be sent to his gun, thereby enabling an important gun to remain in action. Residence at enlistment: Bonnerville Apartments, Helena, Montana.

*Cecil J. Widdifield*, second lieutenant, Sixth Regiment, United States Marine Corps. For extraordinary heroism in action near St. Etienne, France, October 5, 19 18. He voluntarily went forward for a distance of 800 meters under heavy shell fire and rescued a wounded soldier who had been left there the night before when the advance patrols had been withdrawn. Residence at appointment: Troy, Montana.

*Frank Zilkey*, corporal, Company D, Sixteenth Infantry. For extraordinary heroism in action near the Forest of Argonne, France, October 9, 1918. After all the other members of his squad had been killed or wounded in advancing on a hostile machine gun, he pressed forward alone in the face of direct fire from the gun, and by remarkable courage captured both the gun and its crew. Upon his own initiative, he then started out alone to attack another gun and was killed. Emergency address, Mrs. J. J. Carr, mother, May, Idaho. Residence at enlistment: Butte, Montana.
