[Missoulian Oct. 3, 1918: Bonser, Sioux Joins Marines

Descendant of Sitting Bull Will Go to Mare Island October 12.

H.H. Bonser, Sioux Indian and descendant of Sitting Bull, the famous chieftain yesterday passed the physical test for admission to the United States marines, and will soon go to join his three brothers on the firing line in France.

"They say the Indian's fighting blood gets up sometimes," he said last night. "Well, mine is up now. One brother has been wounded—he is LaVergne. I have had 18 years of regular military training in Minnesota and at Carlisle. Now I have a chance to use this training. I am going."

Bonser will leave behind his wife and his children when he hits the warpath on the trail of the Hun. He will take them with him today to his home near Polson, and then will prepare to leave to report at Mare Island October 12.

Bonser is well known in Missoula to the fans. He played for the greater part of the season at third base for this year's city champions, the Highlanders. His training at Carlisle, where he played for two seasons at second base, showed in his playing here. He also was a substitute on the much feared Carlisle football team in the seasons of 1912 and 1913.

He was born in South Dakota, his birthplace being only three miles from that of his distinguished ancestor. He came to Missoula some time ago, and recently he has been employed by the Northern Pacific railroad. He has a fine hay ranch near Polson, which is now under lease. His brothers, all with the infantry are Delmar, Max and La Vergne. ***SIOUX INDIAN.***

The Distinguished Service Cross is presented to Thomas D. Saunders, Corporal, U.S. Army, for extraordinary heroism in action while serving with Company A, 2d Engineers, 2d Division, A.E.F., at Jaulny, France, September 12, 1918. Corporal Saunders and another soldier, who were acting as wire cutters with the first line of infantry, fought their way forward in advance of their units and were the first to enter Jaulny while it was swept by machine-gun fire, infested with snipers, and still occupied by rear guard detachments of the enemy. After capturing eight Germans in a dugout they searched the caves in the town and took 55 additional prisoners.
